Start and Finish

We are having a soft start this week. This means that our playgrounds are staffed from 0845. The idea is that children can arrive between 0845 hours and 0900. They won't go inside, they will play outside until the bell goes at 9am. I know you will be looking forward to seeing people for the first time in a long while but I do please politely ask that you don't linger outside the school premises. At the end of the day, all children will be dismissed from their designated exits, please ensure that your child knows their after school arrangements. We are promoting 2m distancing in line with government guidelines.

Below is a reminder of your morning arrangements. These will be reviewed at the end of the week and you will be notified of any changes.

P1a: patch at front of school – enter via school main gate

P1b: patch at front of school – enter via school main gate

P1/2: patch at front of school – enter via school main gate

P2: little ones playground – enter via side gate on the back path as normal. A PSA will collect your child from the foot of the path. Please do not come right up to the playground gate. This is a narrow space.

P3/4: little ones playground – enter via side gate on the back path as normal. A PSA will collect your child from the foot of the path. Please do not come right up to the playground gate. This is a narrow space.

P3 big ones playground – children to come in to the playground using the normal path

P4: big ones playground – children to come in to the playground using the normal path

P4/5: big ones playground – children to come in to the playground using the normal path

P5: corridor extension door - please come in the main school gate and wait/line up on the tarmac at the front of the school.

P5/6: external class door – please come in to school using the main school gate at the front of the school and wait/line up on the tarmac at the front of the school.

P6: external class door- please come in to school using the extension gate (sometimes referred to as the After School Club gate) and wait/line up round the back of the school next to your glass classroom door (at the big concrete steps)

P6/7: big ones playground big ones playground – children to come in to the playground using the normal path

P7: big ones playground big ones playground – children to come in to the playground using the normal path





Below is a reminder of our going home arrangements. We cannot pair up siblings at this point in school and all children must exit via their identified door. We thank you for your support with this. It may reduce congestion if you arrange a meeting point with your child, only if this is appropriate.

Please do not send your child/siblings to school if he/she or any of your household has the following symptoms:

Persistent and continuous cough

Fever/high temperature

Loss/change of taste or smell.

Please do not send your child to school if your household is contacted by NHS contact tracers.

Please let the School Office know if any of the above applies to your household so we can take appropriate action.

Please contact NHS Inform for advice on next steps. Compliance with this is incredibly important and is key to the safety of us all.

Children who are displaying these symptoms in school will be sent home (with siblings) and parents should refer to government guidelines.

Please do remind your children that adults will be maintaining a 2m distance from the children and the other adults in school as far as is possible and gently ask that they keep a step back from the adults if they can. This is a BIG change for all of us and we will all have to work together to keep each other safe. Our school is build on kindness and compassion for each other and I know we can do this.





You will notice how fantastic our school grounds are looking at the moment. We are incredibly grateful to Oak Leaf Garden Services and Mr Dunbar who gave up their own time to help ensure our school looked its best for all our children coming back. This huge act of kindness is truly appreciated by everyone at the school. Our Primary Parent Partnership have supported the school hugely during lockdown in many ways including setting up resource stations for food and school supplies, organising our School Caterpillar (aka Mr Kirk), organising a Very Hungry Caterpillar scavenger hunt in addition to coordinating the aforementioned work on the school grounds. We are lucky to have such an engaged and innovative Parent Partnership group. Mrs Kiedowskra and Ms Leslie have been busy preparing our school woods for the children to play and learn in. These are also looking very lovely. We are all so grateful for these endeavours, this will make a huge difference to our children.
