- Support every child to succeed and achieve.

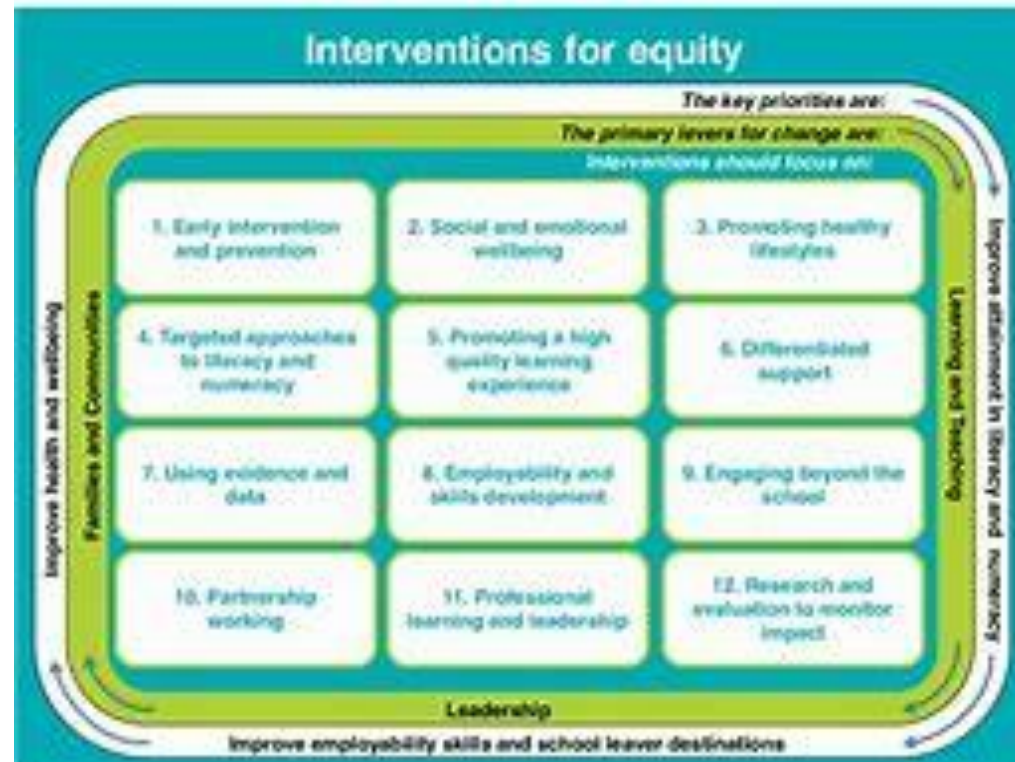
How much is provided to schools?

- The amount we receive depends on the number of children registered for free school meals.



How should this money be spent?

Pupil Support Assistant (PSA)

- We have recruited a PSA who will deliver targeted literacy interventions from Primary 4 to 7 in our school. The aim is to raise attainment in reading and writing.



Digital Technology

- We are investing in a range of chrome books and ipads to support all our children to develop key digital skills that will enhance their learning in all areas. Improving our digital technology skills will help equip our children for learning, life and work in the 21st century.



Sumdog subscription

- Sumdog is a fantastic digital programme that will support all our children to engage with maths and to develop mental fluency. This is a tool that our families can use at home. Through this we aim to raise attainment in numeracy in a fun and engaging way.



Outdoor Shelter
